ESC Background

National ESC

- 1992: ESPC legislation passed by Congress
- 1995: Implementation began following promulgation of DOE's program regulations
- 1998: Procurement process was streamlined to more effectively help agencies to meet their energy use reduction goals

Alabama- ESC

- 2006: Alabama state chapter was founded
- **Mission Statement**: The mission of the Alabama State Chapter of the Energy Services Coalition is to increase the implementation in Alabama of energy efficiency and building upgrades through energy savings performance contracting.

AL Supporting Legislation

Numerous states and the federal government have authorized the use of ESPC to implement capital intensive energy projects in public facilities

- Article 7 Guaranteed Energy Cost Savings Contracts, AL 1975: Projects may be financed for up to 10 years
- Article 7 Guaranteed Energy Cost Savings Contracts, AL 1975, 2006
 Amendment. Projects may be financed for up to 20 years

Executive Orders

May 10, 2006: Executive Order 33

 Reduce energy consumption by 10% by FY 2008, and 20% by FY 2010, relative to FY 2005 levels.

November 15, 2011: Executive Order 25

- Reduce energy consumption by 30% by FY 2015 relative to FY 2005 levels.
- Designate an Energy Officer
- EnergySTAR Portfolio Manager to measure & report progress
- Encouraged to investigate ESPC as a funding method
